You shall teach them diligently to your children, and you shall talk of them when you sit in your house and when you walk on the way, when you lie down and when you rise up. write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates. (Deut. 6:4-9)

captives free, and maintains his faithfulness to those who sleep in the dust. Who is like you, capable of powerful deeds, and who can compare with you? You are a king who causes death and resurrects, and you make salvation sprout forth! You are faithful to resurrect the dead. Blessed are you, O LORD, who resurrects the dead.

You are holy, and your name is holy, and holy ones praise you every day. Blessed are you, O LORD, the holy God.

You bestow knowledge to humans and teach mortals discernment. Grant us knowledge, discernment, and understanding from you. Blessed are you, O LORD, who bestows knowledge.

Forgive us, our Father, for we have sinned. Pardon us, our King, for we have transgressed. For you pardon and forgive. Blessed are you, O LORD, abundantly gracious to forgive.

Take note of our suffering, and take on our struggle, and quickly redeem us for the sake of your name, because you are a strong redeemer. Blessed are you, O LORD, the Redeemer of Israel.

Heal us, O LORD, and we will be healed; save us and we will be saved, for you are our praise. Bring about complete healing for all our ailments. For you, God and King, are a faithful and compassionate healer. Blessed are you, O LORD, healer of the sick among His people Israel.

Bless this year for us, O LORD our God, and bless all its types of produce with goodness.

Send a blessing upon the face of the land. Satisfy us with your goodness, and bless this year as one of the best years. Blessed are you, O LORD, who blesses the years.

Blast the great shofar for our freedom. Lift a banner to gather our exiles, and gather us together from the four corners of the earth. Blessed are you, O LORD, who gathers those who are scattered of His people Israel.

Restore our judges as at first, and our counselors as in the beginning. Take away our grief and groaning, and reign over us – you, O LORD, alone – with devotion and compassion, vindicating us with justice. Blessed are you, O LORD, King who loves righteousness and justice.

Let all your enemies be swiftly cut down, and may you swiftly uproot, shatter, throw down, and humble the arrogant offenders, soon and during our lives. We call you Good because your compassions never stop and Compassionate because your kindness never ends. We place our hope in you.

For all these things, may your name be blessed and lifted up, our King, continually forever and ever. Every living thing will

acknowledge you. They will truly praise your name, the God of our salvation and our help.

Blessed are you, O LORD; "Good" is your name, and it is fitting to thank you.

Place peace, goodness, and blessing, grace, devotion, and compassion upon us and upon all Israel. Bless us, our Father, all of us as one, with the light of your face. For by the light of your face you give us, O LORD our God, the Torah of life, devoted love, righteousness, blessing, compassion, life, and peace. It is good in your sight to bless your people Israel in every moment and in every hour with your peace. Blessed are you, O LORD, who blesses his people with peace.
